Architectural Description

General Architectural Description:

The building at 816 Cantrell St is a two-story single-family house built about 1879, according to the realtor at the time the survey was underway. The property was originally built for residential purposes, and its use remains unchanged. The house exhibits architectural elements typical of the National Folk tradition, a domestic architectural expression that utilized building materials that could be purchased at lumberyards supplied by the growing railroad network in Texas during the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Its plan type is classified as an I-house, a distinctive vernacular domestic form that is two stories in height and has a center hallway with one room on either side. The building has a cross-gabled roof. The building has double-hung windows. The building has a single-door primary entrance. Porch feature(s) include the following: turned wood posts. Landscape feature(s) include the following: plantings. The only ancillary building on the property is a shed.
