Architectural Description

General Architectural Description:

The building at 711 W Main St is a one-story single-family house built in 1895, according to the historical marker associated with the property. The property was originally built for residential purposes, and its use remains unchanged. The building has vinyl siding on the exterior. The house displays features that are associated with the Folk Victorian style, a domestic architectural expression that relied on the use of applied architectural ornamentation on more traditional house forms. The building's distinctive modified L-plan form includes an irregular building footprint with a hipped roof and projecting gable roofs on the front and side. The building has a hipped roof. The internal brick chimney has a corbelled cap. The windows include both fixed and double-hung units with wood sashes. The building has a single-door primary entrance with a wood doorway and frame. Door feature(s) include the following: sidelights, transoms. Porch feature(s) include the following: classical columns. Landscape feature(s) include the following: fencing, plantings, sidewalk, steps. A secondary back house is at the rear of the lot.
